Wheelie Bins

The new Wheelie Bin refuse collection system has been in operation since June 2016. After some initial teething problems over bin deliveries the system has settled down, although some problems remain. The main one is residents putting the wrong items, particularly garden waste, in recycling bins which are then not collected. Also residents of let houses are not following procedures so refuse is building up in gardens and garages. Do help your neighbours if you notice a problem. If you see rubbish dumped in the street do report it to the Council via their website. www.ealing.gov.uk using the "report a problem" link on the home page.

Pavements and Street Trees

If you see problems with pavements and street trees around the Estate you should contact the Council, preferably with a photograph, via their website www.ealing.gov.uk using the report a problem link on the home page. Those with smartphones or tablets can use the Love Clean Streets app which is easy to use after a one off registration.

Consultation on Changes to 112 Bus Route

At the end of last year Transport for London issued a consultation paper on the 112 bus route which runs down Hanger Lane and then turns right into Uxbridge Road at Ealing Common. They propose that the bus should turn right into Madeley Road from Hanger Lane at the Queens Drive junction. The consultation ended on 23rd of November 2016 with implementation due by the summer.

Holy Family School: Meeting the New Head

Your Residents Association recently met with Thomas Doherty the new Head at the School together with Bob Gurd from the Haymills Estate. The school now has 360 pupils building to c450 in 18 months time. Matters discussed included how to progress the School's Travel Plan and the introduction of better traffic / pedestrian management for pupil drop off and collection. With assistance from our Ward Councillor Nigel Sumner LBoE has now identified funding for the originally planned zebra crossing - we await a detailed proposal.

Neighbourhood Watch Update

ALERT: Hanger Hill Ward Police Safer Neighbourhood Team informs us about recent burglaries in Hanger Hill Ward area:

In the first half of February we have had 9 burglaries affecting the following roads in the mid to late afternoon:

- Ashbourne Road x2
- Madeley Road x1
- Greystoke Lodge x1
- Beaufort Close x1
- East Close x1
- Green Vale x1
- Birkdale Road x1
- Boileau Road x1

The main method of entry is via side garden gates or rear garden fences following which the burglars get on the flat or sloping roofs and force first floor windows (bathroom and bedroom).

Suspects are using items from within the gardens to assist them to gain access to higher levels.

Descriptions of suspects disturbed are 2 males, approximately 20-30 years old wearing hooded tops, 1 possibly carrying a rucksack/shoulder bag. Please secure your garden furniture, wheelie bins, lock your door and windows.

Please consider using trellising, prikka strips and anti climb paint to higher level piping. If you have an alarm installed then we would recommend using it. Please consider using lighting timer switches from as early as 3pm.
